Morningside Music Bridge is an international meeting ground for the world's most gifted young musicians ages 12–18 from around the globe. Every July we bring the great artists of tomorrow for a month of intensive music making on a full scholarship basis. Last year saw 690 applicants from 29 countries vying for a total of 66 full scholarships. They are joined by some of the world's most respected performing artists and teachers. Our alumni have become leading classical musicians performing on stages around the world, in key positions with the best orchestras, and teaching at top music schools.

At Morningside Music Bridge we are all about performing and creating. The 2024 program featured 21 concerts over 28 days. This included 16 Emerging Artist Recitals, the Highlights Concert, the String Orchestra Concert, and the Piano 4 Hands Concert. Every student was able to perform at least twice as a soloist (some three times if selected for the Highlights Concert), once with their chamber music group, and another time in the String Orchestra Concert or Piano four hands concert. These performances were complimented by 3 Resident Artist concerts featuring faculty

Students spent the day sight reading chamber music in many different combinations. It was an opportunity to meet and mingle with other participants before the instructional portion of the program commenced.

MMB on tour

Over the years Morningside Music Bridge has organized and sponsored special concerts and events, outside of the regular summer program, featuring outstanding alumni at venues around the globe. These events create performance opportunities for the alumni as well as raise the profile of Morningside Music Bridge. We evolved these formerly isolated events into a more regular part of our offerings as 'Morningside Music Bridge on Tour' and launched this format in November of 2023 featuring alumni in performances in Boston, Poznan, Łódź, Gdansk, Warsaw, and the United Kingdom (at the Wimbledon International

Music Festival and at Heckfield

Place).

On October 3, an ensemble of MMB Alumni joined with the Principal String Players of the Oxford Philharmonic performed Mendelssohn's epic String Octet at 11 Downing Street, in London, U.K. and on October 4 performed with the Oxford Philharmonic Orchestra with Maxim Vengerov playing and conducting Mozart Violin Concertos. In March of 2025, the same alumni will repeat the performance of the Octet and add the Mendelssohn C minor Piano Trio in Oxford and perform at Heckfield Place in Hampshire (heckfieldplace.com).



Jaeden Izik-Dzurko, piano, was the First Prize winner at the 2024 Leeds Piano Competition in the U.K.




Jacques Forrestier, violin, was the First Prize winner of the 2024 Joseph Joachim International






Teng Li, viola alum and MMB
