Morningside Music Bridge

Morningside Music Bridge is an international meeting ground for the world's most gifted young musicians ages 12–18 from around the globe.

Every July we bring the great artists of tomorrow for a month of intensive music making on a full scholarship basis. Our alumni have become leading classical musicians performing on stages around the world, in key positions with the best orchestras, and teaching at top music schools.

The program is operated administratively through the Morningside Music Bridge Foundation with generous support from the Chan family. MMB 2026 will be held at the New England Conservatory from July 12 to August 7, 2026. Application opened October 15 and closes January 08.

MMB 30th Anniversary

Plans are proceeding for some special events linked to the 30th Anniversary:

- Special Artists in Residence Concerts featuring some of our extraordinary alumni during the Boston festival including an opening recital on July 12th featuring piano alum Yuja Wang.
- We welcome and invite String alumni who can make it to Boston or are in the Boston area to join the String Orchestra for the final concert of the summer in Jordan Hall to be held on August 7.

- Alumni International Residency Activities - teaching and performing in Zimbabwe (May 16 – 30) and in Canada's Northwest Territories (September 23 – October 11). Concerts include collaborative performances with local musicians and ensembles and about 4 performances and a variety of teaching activities. Dene fiddler Wesley Hardisty will join the groups for the Northwest Territories activities. Alumni taking part are Amaryn Olmeda, violin (USA); Emad Zolfaghari, viola (Canada); Emma Price, cello (Zimbabwe); and Mohammad Alsheikh, piano (Palestine); Anna Stube, violin (Canada); Brandon Leonard, cello (USA) and Irene Huang, piano and composition (Canada).
- Videographer Emil Agopian will accompany both tours and create video records of them. Post tour Emil will post YouTube video episodes – likely one-a-month for 12 months.




Save the Date: MMB's First Alumni Reunion
