



MMB 2024

We received 690 applications for this summer's program from 29 countries — compared to 444 from 24 countries last year. This is a 55% increase which speaks to the growing reputation of the program but also makes the selection process extremely difficult.

There are 66 students that have received full scholarships to attend this summer's performance program. They will join us in Boston for 4 weeks of extraordinary music making (July 7 to August 2).

The Boston community will enjoy 16 Emerging Artists Recitals, two Student Chamber Music Concerts, the Highlights Concert, the String Orchestra Concert, and three Resident Artist Performances featuring outstanding faculty and alumni from around the world. All concerts except the Resident Artist Concerts will be Live Streamed and will be available on our website.

New Initiatives

After much reflection we concluded that as a world class teaching organisation perhaps we are focussing too much on competition when we could be spending more time on collaborative music making. We are therefore suspending our Concerto Competition for 2024 and extending our Chamber Music curriculum from two weeks to three weeks. The results of the change will be evaluated after this summer's program. As always, we engage in a detailed and comprehensive evaluation process with our participants as part of our commitment to constant improvement.

We have commissioned noted composer, saxophonist, and transdisciplinary artist Neil Leonard to compose a new multimedia work for String Orchestra and video to be premiered by the MMB String Orchestra on August 2 in Jordan Hall.


We are continuing with our Creative Residencies (added to our curriculum in Summer of 2023) and have invited a young composer from Toronto to participate. We will also continue with the Piano Four Hands coaching and performances that were introduced last summer.

Distinguished violist and chamber musician Kim Kashkashian will be leading a Tai Chi class for all the students focussing on preventing practise injuries.

We are inviting representatives from major American music schools to take part in an evening devoted to discussions with our students about options for further study.






Alumni Updates



Jaeden Izik-Durko, piano

Jaeden Izik-Durko attended MMB for four summers and has been celebrated by the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation in 2021 as one of "30 hot Canadian classical musicians under 30." He is a First Prize winner at the 2022 Hilton Head International Piano Competition and the 2022 Maria Canals International Music Competition, and was awarded the First Prize, the Canon Audience Prize, and the Chamber Music Award at the 20th Paloma O'Shea Santander International Piano Competition. He has won the top honour at the 2024 Piano Edition of the Concours musical international de Montréal.

Amaryn Olmeda, violin

In 2023, Amaryn Olmeda made her recording debut as the featured soloist of Carlos Simon's *Between Worlds* on the Sphinx Virtuosi's inaugural recording with Deutsche Grammophon. The Strad Magazine says of her performance, "it receives an impressive reading here by the young musician [and] she shows why she has garnered the word 'prodigy'."

Wojciech Niedziółka, violin

The Dux label in Poland has just released Wojciech's recording of the Henryk Wieniawski *Violin Concerto No. 1* with the Arthur Rubinstein Philharmonic Orchestra. Wojciech was a participant in the inaugural Morningside Music Bridge on Tour concerts in November of 2023.

Yuja Wang, piano

Yuja Wang received a GRAMMY® Award for Best Classical Instrumental Solo for *The American Project* with conductor and composer Teddy Abrams and the Louisville Orchestra.



Earl Lee, cello

MMB Resident Artist and cello alum Earl Lee, Assistant Conductor of the Boston Symphony Orchestra and Music Director, Ann Arbor Symphony will be leading a Boston Symphony Orchestra concert on August 18th at the Tanglewood Music Center featuring musical legend Yo-Yo Ma as soloist in the Schumann Cello Concerto.

Clayton Stephenson, piano

Clayton Stephenson has been announced as a recipient of a 2024 Avery Fisher Career Grant. Clayton also won the Grand Prize at the inaugural Simone Piano Competition performing the Tchaikovsky *Piano Concerto No. 1 in B-flat minor, Op. 23* with the Cincinnati Symphony Orchestra under the baton of Louis Langree.



Sihao He, cello

Sihao He will be joining the Shanghai Quartet in September 2024. The Quartet is lucky to have two MMB Alum as members. Angelo Xiang Yu, violin, joined the group in 2020.



Wenting Kang, viola

Wenting Kang begins her faculty appointment at NEC in Fall of 2024.
